Český Krumlov + Hluboká Castle Tour: With a chauffeured vehicle and your own private guide, this comprehensive full-day tour offers an immersive journey through the picturesque Czech countryside. Upon arrival in the enchanting riverside town of Český Krumlov, we'll begin with a guided tour of the beautiful castle gardens, offering panoramic views of the town and Vltava River. Tours of Český Krumlov Castle are conducted by inhouse docents, and our guide will help you to purchase tickets. After visiting the castle, rejoin our guide for a walking tour through the town's cobblestone streets, learning about Český Krumlov's rich history and admiring its centuries-old architecture. Take some time to enjoy lunch on your own before continuing to Hluboká Castle, known for its Windsor-inspired architecture. Inside, you'll discover elegant period furnishings, lavish woodwork and an impressive collection of art and artifacts. *Tour Duration 10 Hours*

Karlovy Vary Tour: Embark on a full-day journey to the renowned spa town of Karlovy Vary, with a privately chauffeured vehicle and guide to ensure a seamless experience. Upon arrival, your guided walking tour showcases Karlovy Vary's lovely architecture, much of it built in the 18th and 19th centuries when the town emerged as a popular spa resort—drawing notable figures like Tsar Peter the Great. Strolling through the majestic colonnades, you'll be able to sample a selection of the town's 12 curative mineral springs. Following your guided tour, enjoy some free time to explore and have lunch on your own. Shopping opportunities include world-famous Moser Glass, finely crafted porcelain, and boxes of *Oplatky*, a thin wafer cookie famous in the region. *Tour Duration 8 Hours*

Half Day Tour to Karlstejn: This privately guided tour showcases one of the Czech Republic's most enchanting castles. Constructed in the 14th century under the auspices of Charles IV, King of Bohemia and Holy Roman Emperor, Karlstejn was strategically built on a hilltop to protect the crown jewels and important royal documents. Behind its impressive Gothic façade, you'll explore a treasure trove of historic relics, including beautifully preserved artifacts that reflect the castle's storied past. Highlights of your visit will include an exquisite collection of fine art and the crown jewels of the Czech Kingdom. The 45-minute drive from Prague takes you through the picturesque Bohemian countryside, where rolling hills and charming villages create a serene backdrop for your journey. Note that there is an uphill walk from the parking lot to the castle entrance. *Tour Duration 5 Hours*

Half Day Tour to Terezin: Explore tragic and poignant chapters of World War II history on this privately guided tour of Terezin. Situated 30 miles north of Prague, this somber site is contained within the walls of a historic fortress built by Emperor Joseph II in the late 1700s, originally intended as a military stronghold. In 1940, Terezin was repurposed into a concentration camp to detain Jews deported from Czechoslovakia, Germany, Austria, and beyond. Over 150,000 Jews were imprisoned here for months or even years, enduring inhumane conditions before being sent to their deaths in Nazi extermination camps. The Terezin Memorial offers a haunting glimpse into this dark period, featuring educational exhibits that deepen your understanding of the Holocaust. This tour is a solemn reminder of the past and an opportunity to reflect on the lessons of history. *Tour Duration 5 Hours*

Half Day Tour to Kutná Hora: Founded in the Middle Ages, Kutná Hora developed into a prosperous town thanks to the fortunes amassed from the nearby silver mines, which were among the richest in Europe. Once a royal residence for Czech kings, including Wenceslas IV and Charles IV, this charming town is home to several important landmarks that you will explore today with your private guide. Marvel at the breathtaking interior of the Cathedral of St. Barbara, a late Gothic masterpiece with intricate vaults and stunning stained glass. Then visit the Italian Court, which served as the Royal Mint for over 400 years starting in 1326, and discover the history behind its role in producing the famous Prague groschen, a currency that shaped trade in the region. Before returning to Prague, you'll also visit Sedlec Ossuary, a medieval chapel adorned with more than 40,000 bones—artistically arranged to create a captivating if somewhat eerie atmosphere. Dating to the 14th century, this unique site offers insights into medieval customs surrounding death and remembrance. *Tour Duration 5 Hours*
